Essential Information

Our September to December 2020 programme will be delivered as a blended programme of digital and real-life events with each event being marked as **digital**, with a physical **address** and **location** or a **TBC** in light of Covid-19 and as the programme progresses chronologically, it is our hope to convert the TBC locations to real-life.

For digital events:

All digital events will be delivered via a professional Zoom platform and hosted by NE1 CAN.

Teacher / careers lead / lecturer / TA will be responsible for registering in advance and arranging suitable technology for delivery on the day, e.g. projected from laptop onto white board at the front of class.

All students must attend with a teacher / careers lead / lecturer / TA to supervise and accompany at the event.

Events have been designed to be watched and delivered with interaction from speakers and students.

For the majority of events, all cameras and microphones will be turned off and muted with NE1 CAN controlling the production.

Students will be required to complete either a digital poll or a feedback form at the end of the event in place of a paper copy.

For real life events:

All education providers will be responsible for transporting students to the location on time.

All education providers will accept and adhere to the business's current Covid-19 regulations, information of which will be provided in advance.

Students will be responsible for bringing any water, refreshments, individual pens and paper as these will not be provided at the venue.
