Facilitating over 40 events per annum, NE1 CAN works to three key objectives;

- 1 Helping young people understand what careers are available
- 2 Helping young people understand what careers are available here in the North East
- 3 Helping young people understand how to get there

Our events enable employers to have constructive conversations with employees of the future providing the opportunity to break down barriers, discuss employability skills and take learning out of the classroom and into the real world of work.

U16 students must be accompanied by a member of teaching or support staff.

All digital events will be recorded, educational leaders and individuals must ensure all cameras and microphones are turned off for the duration of the event, unless otherwise advised by a member of the NE1 CAN team. Failure to do so may result in removal from the event.

Mobile Phones, Cameras etc

During arranged activities:

Interactions with Children and Young People

Where your role requires that you interact with children and young people you must:

- Present your photo ID and/or DBS if requested
- Interact with children as required within your professional capacity and report any instances/concerns/observations you may have immediately to a senior member of NE1 CAN staff

GDPR

NE1 CAN will request the bare minimum of personal data required in order for young people to access our events. Any information which is provided, e.g. email address, name, will be deleted, wherever and whenever possible, or kept in a secure digital location password protected and accessible by two members of staff and said password will be changed on a regular basis.
